



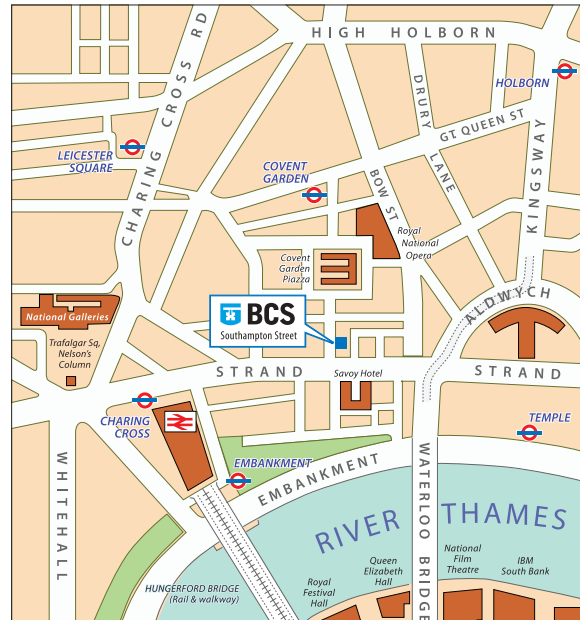

Workshop 1 Internet Computing

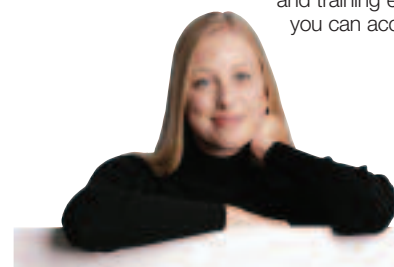
Thursday 4 May 2006, London

Health Informatics is the knowledge, skills and tools that enable information to be collected, managed, used and shared to support the delivery of healthcare and to promote health.
